Tickets Selling Out Fast for the One Night Movie Event

"The Anonymous People" is a documentary film about the emerging new addiction recovery advocacy movement, which concerns the 23.5 million Americans living in long-term recovery from alcohol and other drug addiction. A screening of the independent film written and produced by Greg Williams is being hosted locally by Seabrook House. 'The Anonymous People' places the focus on the people living in long-term recovery from addictions."
