SEABROOK HOUSE COLLABORATES WITH DEA ON PROJECT "HOPE"

Seabrook, NJ - Seabrook House has teamed up with The Drug Enforcement Administration-New Jersey Division, The New York/New Jersey High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area and treatment facilities New Hope Foundation and Integrity House, on the project "HOPE: Chronicles of Drug Addiction and Recovery."

Project HOPE aims to create awareness for substance use disorders and encourages those suffering and their family members to get help. It spreads the message through written art that recovery is possible. Recovering addicts in New Jersey were asked to submit a short story or poem to Project HOPE, which will be compiled into a book and featured at the HOPE event. Also at the event, individuals will share their stories of hope and recovery with those in attendance.

The HOPE event is scheduled to take place on June 7, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. It will be held at The Kelsey Theater of Mercer County Community College in West Windsor, New Jersey.
